

Must submit two letters of references one academic reference from a teacher or counselor and one personal reference from an employer, pastor, coach or a leader from an organization of which you are an active member. ***Archonette applications must have a reference from your Archonette Advisor*** Must submit a response to the essay question (between 300-500 words) formatted 12 point font-Times New Roman Must complete the linked Scholarship Application Form electronically no later than 11:59 pm on March 15, 2025.
